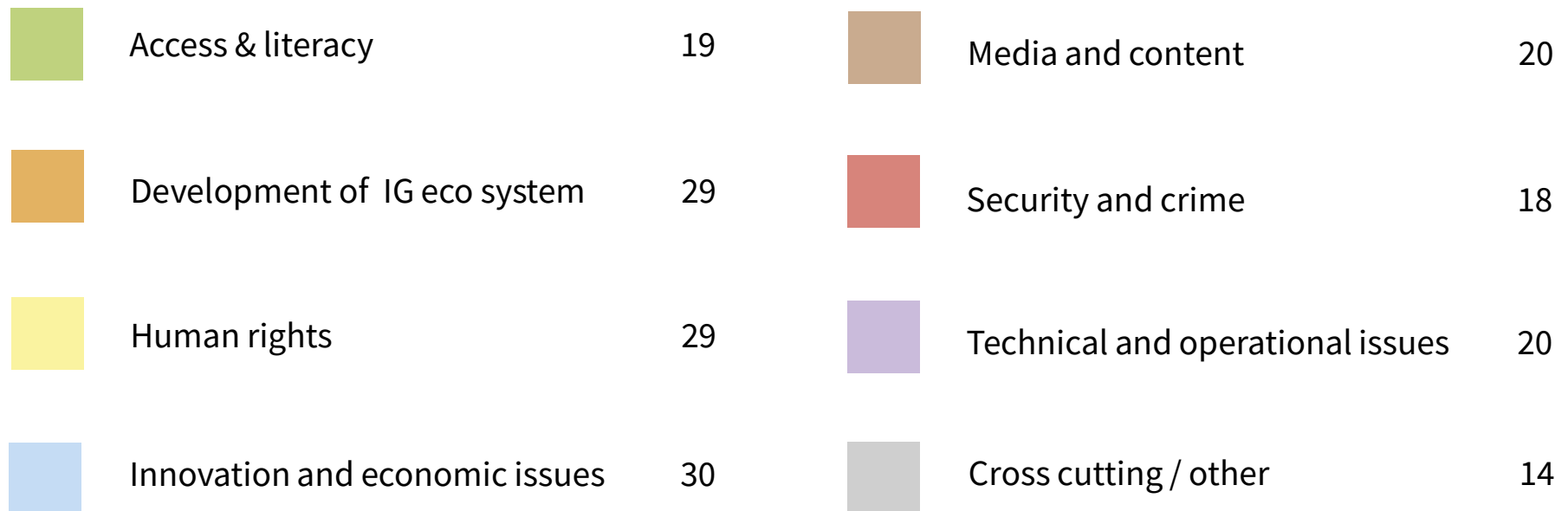
Milestones for EuroDIG 2020

- 1 March 2020: Registration opens
- 8 – 10 June YOUthDIG in Trieste (application possible in February 2020)
- 10 – 12 June 2020 EuroDIG in Trieste

EuroDIG 2020 – what would we like to achieve?

- Produce practical outcomes, identify next steps for a problem
- Find ways for proper policy governance
- Overcome the discrepancy of legislation and technical standards (i. e. evidence based facts like cross border issues and content regulation)
- Keep sessions practical (focus on the end users)
- Warrant the European perspective to help develop policy
- Get in ALL stakeholder and increase EuroDIGs relevance
- Shape the programme in a way to address new European parliament, commission and the Council of Europe
- Connect the programme to last years discussion (follow up process)
- More focused approach leading to action
- Age balance (youth participation)
- local participants and local topics of interest
- Connecting to intersessional activities of the IGF (DC, BPF, ...)



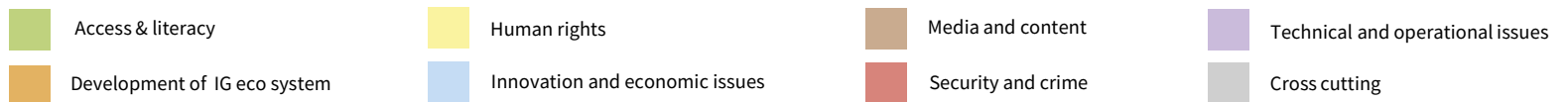
